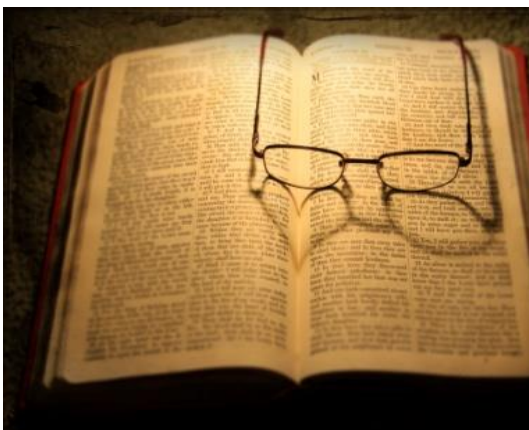
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**A LITTLE PRAYER FOR

Something really different today; to help to uplift our spirits in these concerning times, thought perhaps it would be nice to share it. All I did was visit our local Chemist for prescription refills.

With the App which the local Chemist put on my phone last year, I can put in the orders on the phone; then they send me a text when it is done and ready to pick up. just go and pick it up. So nice and quick and saves time waiting around. Easy for them, and easy for me!

Order for today put in, took an unusually long time until the text came through. At last the text - park the car, walk to the door – can't go in, it won't open. Notice says to enter through Mall entrance. Following instructions, the shop appears half-closed, with only one doorway open. Then quite unusual, a queue waiting – spaced out 1.5mts apart. A chemist assistant standing and greeting each customer, and asks what they are going in for. If it is a genuine item, the assistant asks customer to wait, looks around the shop – counting the current ones inside – then it is either just wait a little longer please or go on in (when an inside customer leaves). Should add in here, that one person was declined entrance and needed to vacate the queue. If said to “go ahead and wait on their own newly appeared cross on the floor”, first their hands are sanitized by the assistant, then they can go ahead (even my new clear vinyl disposable gloves were sanitized). Eventually it was my turn to approach the ‘cordoned off’ counter, collected the scripts and vacate the store via the only door available.

If you're thinking this was a bit of an arduous task – please think again. It was so calm and pleasant. All the ‘safe’ assistants – cordoned off safely behind the counter - were so nice and happily greeted everyone. The ones in the queue often turned to smile and say ‘hello’ to the next one. It may have taken much more time than “normal”, but what does that matter at this unusual time we are all in this together.

In wonder it was for me, just observing the patience and kindness in humanity all around me. Taking care of each other and ensuring everyone is as safe as possible is the major aim.

Pray with thanks to our Lord, and count our blessings that one is not in a hospital bed; and hopefully, blessings that one of us does not know of any family, friends, or acquaintances who are not just safely staying ‘tucked up’ in home stay. Stay safe and well everyone please.

The Wisdom of Angels

Divine wisdom flows from God into all of the angels of heaven, with those in the highest heaven getting the most direct flow. But if wisdom, like love, flows into all living things, perhaps we can get a taste of it, too.

“We may gather how great angels’ wisdom is from the fact that in heaven there is a communication that involves everyone. The intelligence and wisdom of one individual is shared with another: heaven is where everyone shares everything of value. This is because the very nature of heavenly love is to want what is one’s own to belong to another; so no one in heaven regards his or her good as authentically good unless it is someone else’s as well. This is also the basis of heaven’s happiness. Angels are led into it by the Lord, whose divine love has this same quality.”

Key Concept

Most of us are taught to share from a young age, and there are many people who do it beautifully, especially when it comes to wisdom. In heaven, Swedenborg tells us, that sharing happens all the time, and it’s a source of tremendous joy: “Heaven is where everyone shares everything of value”.

Questions for discussion or reflection

How do you react to the statement that no one in heaven regards their good as authentic unless it’s also someone else’s? Do you think that here on earth there are types of goodness that can’t be shared? What types can be shared?

Think of something good about yourself. Do you share it with others? If so, how? If not, why not?

“There is still another reason, beyond the ones already given, why angels can accept so much wisdom, a reason that in heaven is actually the primary one. It is that they are free of any selfishness; for to the extent that people are free of selfishness they can be wise in divine matters. Selfishness is what closes off our deeper natures from the Lord and heaven opens our outer natures and turns them towards ourselves.” –
Heaven and Hell 272

Key Concept

It’s no surprise that Swedenborg describes angels as selfless. But here he’s also saying that not only is selfishness a bad thing, it’s a huge roadblock to attaining spiritual wisdom – perhaps the biggest obstacle of all. (Just try to imagine that camel passing through the eye of a needle).

Reflection

Do you agree that selfishness is a barrier to true wisdom? Why or why not? Regardless of your answer, why do you think Swedenborg says so in this passage?

Has anyone ever told you that it’s all right to be a little selfish? There are people who run themselves into the ground taking care of everyone else without thinking about themselves; surely it’s not a bad thing for them to also take care of themselves. Would you agree with that statement? If so, where would you draw the line between self-centredness and self-care?
