Chris was also the main photographer for Nunyara Retreat and when pictures and videos are through, Chris will be putting as many as space permits on the website. Do look for them.

In 1948, the American Foundation for the Blind (AFB) planned a world tour for Helen Keller and her companion, Polly Watkins, to make the world aware of the achievements and education facilities that can happen for Blind people. This side of the world, Helen's tour included Australia, New Zealand and Japan. When in Adelaide, Helen gave a talk at the Town Hall in King William Street. This was attended by a very large audience. Helen also visited children in schools; and one of her wishes while in South Australia was to visit a Winery. Penfold Winery at Magill planned this for her.

During her time in Australia, Helen and her companion were in Sydney, Brisbane and Melbourne, as well as Adelaide. Information about Helen Keller's world tour is available on the American Foundation for the Blind (AFB) website. In 1948 the Foundation was based in New York – I guess it probably still is. If you have never seen the film "The Miracle Worker" about Helen's life, it is well worth trying to locate it to see.

Helen attributes much of her beliefs on Emanuel Swedenborg and acknowledges him as a great man who influenced her to achieve so much and to "open her eyes".

Back to Basics Bible Study

This is a new project from Rev. David Moffat. Being conducted via the internet, or sometimes as a face to face meeting, it is considered to be quite important that we really take a look at our Bible again, to glean what is written therein. Messages from the Lord our God are often hidden between the literal senses; and by group collaboration and discussion, there should be some new insights coming through. It is also a "question and answer" methodology, with any particular topic that one would like to talk about, ask about, or discuss – quite simply you are invited to put your topic in.

It sounds very good in this day and age, as all religions are based on the Bible; and in such a busy world that today has become, it is well worth going "back to basics", as sometimes the literal text is inclined to be a bit confusing at times. This is due to the fact that most of it was written so many, many, years ago by different people – and in a language that has been complex. First parts of it were written in ancient Hebrew, then some parts in Aramaic Hebrew, then some parts in Greek Hebrew. After that it was all put together, translated into English, French, German, and so many other languages - too numerous to mention here. But, nevertheless, this one Holy Bible is still is and always will be the Word of God. Let us all, and every nation in the world, enjoy it and hear the Word. The Ten Commandments are, and always will be, the same as when God gave them to Moses all those thousands and thousands of years ago. It is the basic standard of guidelines for living a happy and fulfilling life, learning to love and care for, being kind to each other always. It is the standard that the world relies on for Love, Hope, Peace, and life everlasting.
